





Application Process

The Perse School (Singapore) accepts applications year-round, subject to availability. Kindly submit your application and supporting documents through our online portal. Please note that spaces are not reserved, and placement is confirmed only upon receiving an official letter from us.

To apply, please follow these steps:

1 Complete & Submit the Online Application

Please complete the online application and attach the following documents

- Copy of Child's Passport
- Passport sized photo
- Copy of Birth Certificate
- Photocopies of parents' employment pass or guardian's NRIC and child's dependent pass, student pass or Singapore PR.
- Standardised Test Scores
- Current and previous year school reports (must be officially translated into English)
- School Leaving Certificate (if applicable)
- Specialist Reports (if applicable)
- Immunisation records

2 Pay Application & Assessment Fee

Please complete the payment of the application fee, assessment fee, and any applicable WIDA test fee.

5 Receive Offer

Upon approval of the application and subject to availability, the school will send a placement offer via email. The acceptance letter will include a link to the contract.

3 Assessment and Interview

Students will undergo an entry assessment as part of the admissions process to determine the appropriate year group placement. The principal will make the final decision on their placement.

6 Confirm Enrolment & Pay Fees

Once you sign the contract via DocuSign, the school will issue an invoice for the course fees. Full payment is required within 14 days of signing the Student Contract or before your child starts school, whichever comes first, to confirm and secure the offered place(s).

4 Review Process

Our admissions team will review your application and may request additional information or assessments.

7 Orientation

Our admissions team will provide you with important information about uniforms, transportation, meals, and other details to help prepare your child for the first day of school. You will also be invited to attend an orientation to meet the teachers, staff, and fellow students.


